The Canadian Race Relations Foundation Annual Report to Parliament April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022

INTRODUCTION

The Canadian Race Relations Foundation (CRRF) is pleased to present its Annual Report to both the House of Commons and the Senate in accordance with section 94 of the *Access to Information Act* (ATI Act). The report describes the activities that support compliance with the Act for the fiscal year commencing April 1, 2021 and ending March 31, 2022.

THE PURPOSE OF THE ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT

This Annual Report is prepared and tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 94 of the Access to Information Act. The purpose of the Access to Information Act is to provide a limited right of access to information contained in records under the control of most government institutions and certain other organizations created by Parliament, such as Canadian Race Relations Foundation (CRRF). The information is subject to certain limited and specific exceptions. The ATI Act is based upon the principles that the public should have a right of access to information about government activities, that exceptions to this right should be limited and specific, and that decisions about access should be subject to independent review. The ATI Act is intended to complement, not replace, established channels of communication.

In accordance with the Access to Information Act, this Annual Report on the administration of the Access to Information Act describes how the CRRF discharged its responsibilities in relation to the Act in the fiscal year 2021-2022. The CRRF is not reporting on behalf of wholly owned subsidiaries or non-operational institutions.

MANDATE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF CRRF

The CRRF was established as part of the Japanese Canadian Redress Agreement of 1988. *The Canadian Race Relations Foundation Act* was passed in 1990 and proclaimed in 1996 "...to facilitate throughout Canada the development, sharing and application of knowledge and expertise in order to contribute to the elimination of racism and all forms of racial discrimination in Canadian society..." The CRRF opened its doors in November 1997. A Crown Corporation, one of the portfolio agencies of the Department of Citizenship, Immigration and Multiculturalism Canada, the CRRF operates at arm's length from the Government of Canada. The CRRF also has registered charitable status. Its operating income is derived primarily from the income generated by the investment of the endowment fund.

The CRRF is a leading and authoritative national voice and agent of change for the elimination of all forms of racism, and the promotion of a more harmonious Canada. The CRRF is a leader in the development of a national framework for eliminating all forms of racism and helping to strengthen Canadian identity as it refers, for example, to the principles of equality of opportunity, fairness, justice and human dignity. The CRFF will advance understanding of the past and present causes and manifestations of racism, and work toward its elimination through the promotion of effective and harmonious race and ethnic relations, civic responsibility, research, supporting and promoting the development of national policies, and the establishment of information databases.

The CRRF has no formal mandate or the power to investigate complaints and impose sanctions, but may make recommendations to policymakers on the elimination of racism.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The Governor-in-Council, acting on the recommendation of the Minister responsible for Multiculturalism, appoints all members of the Board and the Executive Director.

The CRRF's strategic direction is vested in a Board of Directors consisting of a chairperson and up to 11 other members from various regions of Canada. During the fiscal year 2021-2022, there were eleven (11) members. This list of the Board is posted on the CRRF website.

An Executive Director, who serves as Chief Executive Officer and an ex-officio member of the Board, manages the CRRF's daily operations.

DESCRIPTION OF STRUCTURE

The Director of Finance and Administration assumes the responsibility to respond to ATI requests.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION AND PRIVACY

It should be noted that the staff complement of the CRRF during the period under review was twenty (20) full-time, in addition to the Executive Director.

STATEMENT OF DELEGATION ORDER

A Delegation Order has been granted under the Act with respect to the administration of access to information requests, without the need to create a separate department to respond (For more information on the delegation of powers, see Appendix A). The person responsible for administering these applications is the Director of Finance and Administration.

HIGHLIGHT OF THE STATISTICAL REPORTS

During the 2021-2022 reporting period, the CRRF received seven requests under the *Access to Information Act*, two from media and five from public. Five requests were disclosed within legislative timelines and two requests were carried forward to the next reporting period. Two requests carried forward from the prior reporting period, 2020/2021, were also closed in April 2021 and there is no active requests outstanding from any previous reporting periods.

There was no impact of COVID-19-related measures on our ability to fulfill our *Access to Information Act responsibilities* and any mitigation measures that were implemented.

INTERPRETATION OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT

The 2021-2022 request volume increased 71% above the previous 3-year average, with the number of requests received increasing to seven. In this reporting period, seven requests were disclosed within legislative timelines and two requests were carried forward to the next reporting period.

TRAINING AND AWARENESS

No formal training was undertaken during the reporting period.

SIGNIFICANT ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES

During the period covered by this report, CRRF increased its personnel capacity to 20 full time staff by creating 15 new positions. This was as a result of \$11M funding from Government of Canada for two years. CRRF developed and launched fresh initiatives and funding streams to support improved race relations in Canada and piloted new anti-racism programs with various partners.

OVERVIEW OF NEW AND/OR REVISED INSTITUTIONAL ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

POLICY FOR MONITORING TIME OF PROCESS

CRRF did not implement any new or revised specific policies, guidelines, and procedures related to access to information during the reporting period.

DESCRIPTION OF MAJOR CHANGES

Beginning on March 17, 2020, the large majority of the CRRF activity moved offsite to teleworking as part of anti COVID-19 measures. An ATIP consultant was hired to assist the ATIP coordinator in processing the requests and provide recommendations on the application of the Access to Information Act.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION COMPLAINTS, AUDITS, ETC.

One complaint was received during this period, and which Notice of Intention to Investigate and Summary of Complaint was issued by the Information Commissioner of Canada. The Commissioner carried out an investigation and subsequently issued a report that the complaint was resolved. There is no complaints that are outstanding from previous reporting periods.

MONITORING THE TIME TO PROCESS ACCESS TO INFORMATION REQUESTS

Monitoring was conducted during the reporting period mostly through ATIP consultant's level of effort spent on a request and subsequent payments of ATIP related invoices.

APPENDIX A

CANADIAN RACE RELATIONS FOUNDATION Delegation Order under the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act

Pursuant to sections 73 of the *Access to Information Act* and the *Privacy Act*, I hereby delegate my powers, duties, and functions to the persons who hold the positions set out in the Schedule hereto, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) that the persons to whom my powers, duties, or functions are delegated are bound in the exercise of those powers, duties, or functions by the jurisdictional, legislative, and administrative limitations to which I am subject;
- (b) that the powers, duties, or functions delegated to any person may also be exercised by another person who holds the person's position in an acting capacity to which he or she has been duly appointed;
- (c) that notwithstanding the Delegation Order of my powers, duties, or functions, I may exercise at any time any of the powers, duties, or functions delegated.

This Delegation Order is effective on and from the date shown below and shall remain in effect until revoked. I may revoke or amend this Delegation Order at any time. This Delegation Order supersedes all previous Delegation Orders.
