The Canadian Race Relations Foundation Annual Report to Parliament April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022

This Annual Report is tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 72 of the ATI Act.

INTRODUCTION

About the Privacy Act

The Privacy Act (the Act), which took effect in 1983, obliges approximately 250 federal government departments and agencies to respect the privacy rights of individuals by limiting the collection, use and disclosure of their personal information. *The Privacy Act* also gives individuals the right to request access to personal information about themselves that may be held by federal government organizations (Section 2 of the Act). If individuals feel that the information is incorrect or incomplete they also have the right under the Act to ask that it be corrected. The law also protects an individual's privacy by preventing others from having access to that personal information and allows an individual specific rights concerning the collection and use of his/her information.

Section 72 of *the Privacy Act* requires that the head of every government institution and agency prepare, for submission to Parliament, an annual report on the administration of the Act within the institution during each financial year. This annual report describes how Canadian Race Relations Foundation administered its responsibilities under *the Privacy Act*.

Canadian Race Relations Foundation Mandate

The CRRF was established as part of the Japanese Canadian Redress Agreement of 1988. *The Canadian Race Relations Foundation Act* was passed in 1990 and proclaimed in 1996 "...to facilitate throughout Canada the development, sharing and application of knowledge and expertise in order to contribute to the elimination of racism and all forms of racial discrimination in Canadian society…" The CRRF opened its doors in November 1997. A Crown Corporation, one of the portfolio agencies of the Department of Citizenship, Immigration and Multiculturalism Canada, the CRRF operates at arm's length from the Government of Canada. The CRRF also has registered charitable status. Its operating income is derived primarily from the income generated by the investment of the endowment fund.

The CRRF is a leading and authoritative national voice and agent of change for the elimination of all forms of racism, and the promotion of a more harmonious Canada. The CRRF is a leader in the development of a national framework for eliminating all forms of racism and helping to strengthen Canadian identity as it refers, for example, to the principles of equality of opportunity, fairness, justice and human dignity. The CRFF will advance understanding of the past and present causes and manifestations of racism, and work toward its elimination through the promotion of effective and harmonious race and ethnic relations, civic responsibility, research, supporting and promoting the development of national policies, and the establishment of information databases.

The Privacy Act recognizes the right of citizens to have access to their personal information held by government institutions.

Canadian Race Relations Foundation

The CRRF has no formal mandate or the power to investigate complaints and impose sanctions, but may make recommendations to policymakers on the elimination of racism.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The Governor-in-Council, acting on the recommendation of the Minister responsible for Multiculturalism, appoints all members of the Board and the Executive Director.

The CRRF's strategic direction is vested in a Board of Directors consisting of a chairperson and up to 11 other members from various regions of Canada. During the fiscal year 2021-2022, there were eleven (11) members. This list of the Board is posted on the CRRF website.

An Executive Director, who serves as Chief Executive Officer and an ex-officio member of the Board, manages the CRRF's daily operations.

DESCRIPTION OF STRUCTURE

The Director of Finance and Administration assumes the responsibility to respond to requests for information.

Access to Information and Privacy

It should be noted that the staff complement of the CRRF during the period under review was twenty (20) full-time, in addition to the Executive Director.

STATEMENT OF DELEGATION ORDER

A Delegation Order has been granted under the Act with respect to the administration of Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act requests, without the need to create a separate department to respond (For more information on the delegation of powers, see Appendix A). The person responsible for administering these applications is the Director of Finance and Administration.

STATISTICAL REPORTS

During the 2021-22 fiscal year, the CRRF received **one request** under *the Privacy Act*. Please see Appendix B for the completed form: Statistical Report on *the Privacy Act*. There was no impact of COVID-19-related measures on our ability to fulfill our Privacy Act responsibilities and any mitigation measures that were implemented.

INTERPRETATION OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT

One request was received in 2021-22 which subsequently was abandoned by the requester.

PRIVACY IMPACT ASSESSMENTS (PIA)

Per Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat (TBS) guidelines, a PIA is considered complete once an approved copy has been submitted to both the Office of the Privacy Commissioner and TBS. According to this definition, CRRF did not complete a PIA during the reporting period.

A PIA was developed during the last quarter of the reporting period however to identify and mitigate any potential privacy risks in relation to the CRRF's new "National Anti-Racism Fund". In the course of this work, a new Personal Information Bank (PIB) was developed to account for the CRRF's privacy practices for any past and future funding initiatives. The PIA was completed after the reporting period and the new PIB is pending TBS approval.

The CRRF is in the process of creating a PIA summary page on its website.

DATA MATCHING ACTIVITIES

As the CRRF does not collect personal information, beyond the description above, no data matching or sharing was done.

PRIVACY EDUCATION AND TRAINING

No formal training was undertaken during the reporting period.

DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

During the reporting period, the CRRF did not disclose personal information pursuant to subsection 8(2) of the *Privacy Act*.

PRIVACY BREACHES

No privacy breaches occurred during the reporting period.

SIGNIFICANT ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES

During the period covered by this report, CRRF increased its personnel capacity to 19 full-time positions. This was as a result of \$11M funding from the Government of Canada for two years. CRRF developed and launched fresh initiatives and funding streams to support improved race relations in Canada and piloted new anti-racism programs with various partners.

OVERVIEW OF NEW AND/OR REVISED INSTITUTIONAL PRIVACY ACT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

During the reporting period, the CRRF worked to evolve its privacy program, developing a new corporate privacy policy and privacy breach procedure. These policy instruments were not implemented during the reporting period but will receive approval in the 2022-23 reporting period.

The CRRF did not seek and/or receive authority for any new collection(s) or new consistent use(s) of Social Insurance Numbers during the reporting period.

POLICY FOR MONITORING TIME OF PROCESS

Except for this reporting period, the CRRF did not receive any request under *the Privacy Act* in the prior reporting periods, and hence no policy has been established for monitoring the time of process so far.

DESCRIPTION OF MAJOR CHANGES

Beginning on March 17, 2020, the large majority of the CRRF activity moved offsite to teleworking as part of anti COVID-19 measures.

- (b) that the powers, duties, or functions delegated to any person may also be exercised by another person who holds the person's position in an acting capacity to which he or she has been duly appointed;
- (c) that notwithstanding the Delegation Order of my powers, duties, or functions, I may exercise at any time any of the powers, duties, or functions delegated.

This Delegation Order is effective on and from the date shown below and shall remain in effect until revoked. I may revoke or amend this Delegation Order at any time. This Delegation Order supersedes all previous Delegation Orders.
