THE COURT: All right, so, Mr. DeSousa, listen carefully and Mr. MacAdam, the Crown, is going to read in the allegations. Go ahead, Mr. MacAdam. MR. MacADAM: Thank you. On June 17th, 2020, Mr.

DeSousa appeared in the Ontario Court of Justice

where he was convicted of assaulting a peace officer and uttering threats. He was placed on probation for 12 months with one of the conditions being that he keep the peace and be of good behaviour. On Saturday, January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021, Constable Daniel Shortt was engaged in his duty as a sworn police officer at the City of Toronto.

Officer Shortt was patrolling in a marked police car in a uniformed capacity to the area of Warden Avenue and St. Clair Avenue East. Officer Shortt's attention was drawn to Mr. DeSousa who was standing in the middle of the roadway and appeared to be having interactions with a motorist's vehicle which was stopped on the roadway. Mr. DeSousa's actions were animated, the interaction appeared to be heated. Officer Shortt looked up to Mr. DeSousa who could be overheard yelling and cursing at the motorist. As Mr. DeSousa saw Officer Shortt, he waived to the motorist and the motorist drove away.

Mr. DeSousa's attention was then on Officer Shortt, and Mr. DeSousa immediately started berating Officer Shortt. Officer Shortt attempted to deescalate the situation and speak with Mr. DeSousa, and Mr. DeSousa threatened Officer Shortt by stating, "You're gonna make me miss my bus and I'll fuck you up. I'm going to smash you nigger and take your uniform and I'll fuck you up." Officer Shortt placed Mr. DeSousa under arrest after a brief struggle. And Mr.


