

ARRAIGNMENT AND PLEA

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COURT CLERK: This is information 21-A11617, Christopher Taylor, you are charged on or about the 19th day of October in the year 2021, at the City of Ottawa, in the East Region, did resist Constable

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4. R. v. Christopher Elmer Taylor Plea of Guilty

Eric Lepage, last name L-E-P-A-G-E, a peace officer in the execution of his duty, contrary to Section 129(a) of the Criminal Code of Canada.

You are further charged that on or about the 19th day of October in the year 2021, at the City of Ottawa, in the East Region, did by word of mouth knowingly utter a threat to cause death to Constable Feisal Bila Houssein, first name F-E-I-S-A-L, last name B-I-L-A, space, H-O-U-S-S-E-I-N, contrary to Section 264.1(2) of the Criminal Code of Canada.

On December 14th, 2021, the Crown elected to proceed summarily in this matter. Mr. Taylor, what is your plea to these charges as read, guilty or not guilty? CHRISTOPHER TAYLOR: Guilty. COURT CLERK: Thank you.

THE COURT: Can I have the facts please, Mr. Moreno?

MR. MORENO: Certainly, Your Honour. So, at the time of this offence, Mr. Taylor was on a probation order requiring him to keep the peace and be of good behaviour. On October 19th, 2021, both Officer Lepage and Officer Houssein approached Mr. Taylor and it was determined that he, there, a warrant was out for his arrest. During the process of that arrest Mr. Taylor told Officer Houssein who was black, "I have punched an officer before. I am not afraid to do it again nigger". Then during the process of that arrest Mr. Taylor began folding his

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
